## **Extreme** Cold **Defined**

-18°F windchill

Frostbite within < 30 minutes

#### **TEMP Plan Activation**

5-step escalation process to activate the local TEMP Plan





Severe weather is possible, but unlikely. Maintain normal services.



Watch

Severe weather is a moderate possibility. 7-9 days. Notify partners.



Advisory

Severe weather is a high probability. 4-6 days. Put together plans.



Warning

Severe weather is imminent. 2-3 days. Emergency is Declared by City or County that Emergency Services will activate.

\*Homeless Plan is Activated.



All-Clear

Severe weather has ended. Begin closure process.



### Extreme Cold Weather Drop-In Services

WARMING CENTER: SHARE Center



- Provide Day Warming Services 8am to 5pm Everyday
  - Up to 50 people with families on the Cafeteria side of the facility
  - Up to 40 people on the Drop-In side of the facility
- Provide:
  - Water
  - Blankets if available
  - Food
- Shelter
  - Red Cross Approved
    - Overnight Shelter for up to 14 men in emergency

### Extreme Cold Weather Shelter Capacity

By Location

- First Congregational Church serving women, families, & LGBTQ+ community
  - Up to 60 individuals total, including up to 6 families
- Haven of Rest
  - Up to 25 additional men (above current 50-person capacity)
  - Up to 25 additional women/families (above current 50-person capacity)
- Battle Creek Homeless Shelter
  - Up to 56 men
  - Up to 12 women
- SAFE Place
  - Currently, 19 rooms, up to 55 beds



### **Expected Needs**

**Across Locations** 

- Volunteers to support expanded shelter capacity
  - Includes training for volunteers (target early December)
- Twin-sized Blankets
- Hand Sanitizer, Toilet Paper, Masks, and Cleaning Supplies
- Bottled Water and Non-perishable, Individual-sized Food Items
